In the Classroom:

Some of our vocabulary lessons this quarter have included: Hygiene, Bill Payment, and Nutrition. Along with each list of vocab words and definitions, the class completes projects, both hands-on and worksheets, that help to reinforce the vocabulary words and concepts they represent.

In January, the students completed a "Word of the Year" Vision Board project. Each person reflected on 2023 and decided what they could use more or less of in their life, what their weaknesses are, some of their admirable traits, and some of the experiences they had in 2023. They then decided what they wanted to have as the focus for 2024 and chose a "Word of the Year" to represent that idea. Finally, they created a poster to represent that theme.

Another project students have been working on is "The Perfect Date." Using their computers, the students are researching different aspects of a possible date and filling that information into a slide document detailing their "perfect date." Information includes where they would go, what they would do, where they would eat, the clothes they would wear, good conversation topics and what it would cost.
